### Welcome aboard the Carnival Conquest!

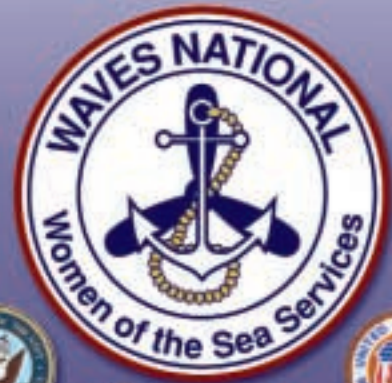

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **What activities are available on board?**

The following activities and entertainment are just a sample of what is available on all "Fun Ship" cruises. Gala Captain's Dinner, Captain's Cocktail Party, Past Guest Party (on cruises 5-days or longer), Camp Carnival - year round supervised children's activities (ages 2-15), Singles Cocktail Party, Full Gambling Casino - Gaming Lessons Tournaments: Blackjack; Slots; Poker, 3 Bands and Orchestras (Calypso, Dance Music, Easy-Listening), Karaoke, Briefings on each Port-Of-Call, Shopping Talk, Gala Midnight Buffet (on cruises 3-days or longer), Nightclub shows each evening at sea, Midnight shows, Spa Carnival Program, Beauty Seminars, Pathway to Yoga Body walk Power Walk Pathway to Pilates, Body Stretching Class Kickboxing Class, Low Impact Aerobics Body Cycle Class, Body Symmetry Stretch and Relax, First-Run movies featured daily on the in-cabin TV, Ping Pong, Shuffleboard, Volleyball, Golf Putting, Video Arcade, Art Auction at Sea, Card Players meet and play, Guest Talent Show, On Board Duty-Free Shopping, Bingo Sessions, Library: books and board games to borrow, Midnight Deck Party, Dance classes, Galley Tour, Ice Carving Demonstrations, Debarkation Talk, Fun and Games with the Cruise Director and Social Staff (Note: Games vary and are up to the discretion of the Cruise Director) Trivia Who Wants to be a Millionaire?, Win/Lose/Draw, Battle of the Sexes, Scavenger Hunt Ship Building Competition, "Survivor", Game Show Mania, Lido Deck and Pool Games.

### **What is the Fountain Fun Card?**

We will offer to all guests the option to purchase a "Fountain Fun Card" which will allow them unlimited soft drinks for the duration of the cruise at a one time purchase price (including gratuities). The "Fountain Fun Card" can be purchased at the casino; lobby and pool bar onboard the ship. In all locations where beverage service is offered, guests may receive a glass of the soft drink of their choice - one glass will be served at a time and only to the guest whose name appears on the card. The card cannot be used through room service. NOTE: A 15% gratuity will automatically be added on at the time of purchase of the Fountain Fun Card.

### **Carnival's VIP Check-In**

Carnival's VIP Check-in is an exclusive service designed to afford our Platinum guests, and those traveling in deluxe suite accommodations, with special registration privileges.

### **Is there a dress code for the dining room?**

Is there a dress code for the dining room? Depending on the length of the cruise, either formal dress or casual resort wear is required in the Dining Room. The dress requirement for children is the same. For those not wanting to dress up, the Lido restaurants are open nightly (with the exception of the last evening of the cruise), and have a casual dress code. Formal Wear: tuxedo (optional); suit and tie; sport coat, tie and slacks; evening gown; cocktail dress; pantsuit Casual Resort Wear: sport shirts and slacks; dresses; skirts; pantsuit NOTE: Shorts, t-shirts and bathing attire are not permitted in the Dining Room during dinner.

### **How much are photos on board?**

The Ship's Photographers take both candid and posed shots all during the cruise. The photos are then put on display, usually the very next day, and are available for purchase (with a Sail & Sign Card). The prices are as follows, depending on the ship: 4-wallet size \$5.00 1-5x7 \$5.95 1- 6x9 \$8.00, 1- 8x10 \$19.95 Special requests can be made by appointment and are available for a fee. Film is available in the Duty-Free shops for purchase. One-day developing service is available for the following types of film. Drop-off boxes are located at the Photo Gallery: 35mm film Disposable cameras. Panorama and APS Advantix Film can be processed on select ships; check with the Photo Manager for details. Developing film onto a CD (select ships: Spirit Pride Conquest Legend Glory).

### **Can I call home while on board?**

For our guest's convenience, the ship's telecommunications network offers direct dialing via satellite from the staterooms telephone. This is available 24 hours a day regardless of the ship's location. This service is closed on the final day of the cruise at 4:00AM. The rate is \$6.99 per minute for calls to the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico and \$9.99 per minute for all International calls. All charges are billed to the guest's on board Sail and Sign Card. Since all communication is via satellite, guests cannot use calling cards, credit cards, dial 800 toll-free numbers nor make a collect calls. Instructions and rates can be found in the cabin's directory.

## A SAMPLING OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

### Montego Bay, Jamaica

**4x4 Cross Country Adventure** - This is your chance to explore Montego Bay's rugged mountainous landscape in a 4-wheel drive vehicle. This fun filled excursion does cover some rough terrain and is not suitable for pregnant women or people suffering from back pain. *(4 Hours \$\$)*

**Pirate Boat Cruise** - Board the pirate ship Calico, a 55' gaff rigged ketch featured in the Walt Disney film, "Return to Treasure Island", and cruise the Montego Bay coastline. *(2.5 Hours \$)*

**Coral Sub Ocean View** - Take a short cruise to the spectacular reefs of Montego Bay aboard a state of the art, specially designed semi-submarine. Note: Snorkel gear is provided on excursion. You must be able to go up and down 7 steps without assistance. *(2.5 Hours \$)*

**Catamaran Snorkel & Doctor's Cave Beach** - This shore excursion is nothing but "fun in the sun" in Montego Bay. Note: Maximum weight is 300 lbs. Children, 12 years old and under, must be accompanied by an adult. A swimsuit, towel and sunscreen are recommended. Complimentary beverages will be served on the boat. This excursion is not recommended for pregnant women or guests with back/neck injuries or heart conditions. *(3.5 Hours \$\$)*

### Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands

**Atlantis Submarine** - Experience the thrill of journeying beneath the sea in the Atlantis XI Submarine, specifically designed for underwater sightseeing excursions. Have ample time for both shopping and sightseeing. Note: Minimum age is 4 years old and minimum height is 3 feet. Capacity of submarine is 48 persons. Depths can dive up to 100'. *(1.5 Hours \$\$)*

**Butterfly Farm & Beach Adventure** - Immerse yourself in two of Grand Cayman's prize natural wonders. Note: The beach has changing rooms, fresh water showers and restrooms. Purchases from the bar and grill are at your own expense. Beach chairs are included; lockers and beach umbrellas are available for rent at your expense. Comfortable walking shoes, towels, swimsuit and sunscreen are recommended. *(3 Hours \$)*

**Stingray City & Island Tour** - Combine the natural beauty and cultural heritage of Grand Cayman with incredible Stingray City Sandbar in this all-in-one combination excursion. Relax on the boat ride out to Stingray City Sandbar where you can stand in the shallow waters, as you swim or snorkel, feed, pet and hold the friendly stingrays. Be provided snorkel equipment and food for the stingrays at no extra cost. This excursion is not recommended for wheelchair guests or those with walking difficulties. *(4.5 Hours \$\$)*

### Cozumel, Mexico

**Cozumel Highlights & Shopping** - Tour Cozumel, the largest island in the Mexican Caribbean, and experience its culture, history, scenic beauty and wonderful shopping. *(4 Hours - \$)*

**Mayan Ruins of Tulum** - Experience the ancient Mayan paradise kingdom rising high above the magnificent crystal blue Caribbean Sea. This excursion is not recommended for wheelchair guests or those with walking difficulties. *(7 Hours \$\$)*

**Dolphin Encounter at Puerto Aventuras** - Take this opportunity to meet the bottle nosed dolphin, one of the ocean's most amazing creatures, up close and personal. Pregnant women are not allowed to participate. For the safety of the dolphins no jewelry can be worn. Duration includes an approximate 45-minute (each way) ferry transfer. *(6.5 Hours - \$\$)*

**\*\*PLEASE CHECK WITH TRAVEL AFFILIATES FOR INFORMATION ON OTHER SHORE EXCURSIONS AND PRICES. You don't have to take a shore excursion to enjoy each port of call. There is also plenty to do onboard the Conquest while we are in each port. The duty free shops are closed while in port, but reopen when we leave each port. There are swimming pools, a SPA, a jogging track and a lot of tanning possibilities, as well as a Library and internet cafe.**

These shore excursions are only a sampling of those offered in the three ports of call. Please check with Travel Affiliates on prices and other tours or check online at [www.carnival.com](http://www.carnival.com) for details. These shore excursions are based on occupancy and may be cancelled if there are not enough signed up for the tour. If you choose not to take a tour/shore excursion and venture out on your own, be advised that you are responsible for your own transportation to and from the ship and must be back onboard at the designated time or you will be left ashore! Be weary of traveling on your own in these ports of call. Safety first! Make sure that someone not touring with you is aware of your shore plans.

Charles, LA on Saturday night September 16, 2006 prior to traveling to Galveston, TX on Sunday, September 17, 2006 and will also provide return transportation on September 24, 2006.
