Norfolk Hosts WAVES 2010 Convention

On August 26th two hundred and two sea service women filled a large ballroom at the Norfolk Waterside Marriott to capacity. It was the kick-off for the 2010 WAVES National Convention. These women come from all across the country, California, Oregon, Texas, Maine, Florida, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Tennessee, Colorado, Wisconsin, Ohio, North and South Carolina, Kentucky,

New York, Maryland and Virginia. They come every two years from virtually everywhere for this event. The Convention gives members the opportunity to visit with old shipmates, make new friends and address the business of the organization. This year the most important item on the agenda was the need to change the name of WAVES National to one more inclusive of today's sea service women. Jeannie Dicks, one of the co-founders of WAVES National, agreed that the name change is necessary to attract and recruit the sea service women of today to our organization.

Convention Chairman Betty Hand said, "These women are amazing and are

repositories of such valuable information and amazing experiences. It is a pleasure to spend time with them. The Convention was a wonderful opportunity to hear stories, first hand, from the women who opened doors and broke glass ceilings.

The memorial service was, as always, the most emotional event at the Convention. The names of 375 members who passed away over the past two years were solemnly read and the bell tolled after each group of 20 names. The service was ended with the singing of Taps.

Forward momentum was the focus of the 2010 Convention. Women's accomplishments this year include, for the first time in history, the selection of women for

truly awesome event! Unit #152, Tidewater Tidal WAVES, did a magnificent job and attendees said this was the best convention, ever! Way to go, ladies! BZ!

The convention was not all fun, however, and much business was accomplished. First and foremost, due to the declining membership, we voted to withdraw free life membership for those 90 years of age and older. Beginning with the new dues year, those who become 90+, will have to pay \$30 for life membership, or continue on an annual basis at the regular membership fee of \$15 per annum. With declining membership, and the granting of free life membership to those 90+ over the past two years, we have incurred a drastic decline in revenue. We have lost 951 members since August of 2008 and we have granted 114 FREE Life Memberships. Your Board of Directors is working on solutions to reverse this decline.

A revised membership application will be published in the December issue and will be made available on our website, as well. In addition to updating the cost of

Life Membership, a block for making a donation to WAVES National will be included. I strongly urge you to make a tax deductible contribution when renewing your membership. Also, please consider a donation to WAVES National when you, or your unit, are looking for a non-profit organization to support.

Included in this issue is an article outlining ads to be placed in White Caps. This is one of many fund raisers we are considering. If you know of someone who would be interested in placing an ad in our newsletter, please pass the information to them. Initially, we anticipate ads from members, but as word of mouth is passed, we could generate additional ads that would appeal to our membership (i.e., travel, restaurants, and embroidery services).

Barb Sebring is chairing the Fund Raising Committee. Please contact her with your suggestions. Her contact information is included on the National Officers and Staff page.

We have had many recommendations to update our image by changing our name

so that the organization appeals to today's women of the sea services. Jeannie Dicks, co-founder of WAVES National, spoke in favor of the name change and said that the name WAVES National was never intended to be permanent, but only as a place holder until another name could be approved. Well, the name has lasted 31 years and Jeannie was most adamant that it is now time for a change. A committee has been formed and will be soliciting recommendations from the membership.

Members approved a new Mission Statement, “To keep all sea service women preserving our common history and sharing our collective military experiences.” Keep in mind that the Mission Statement is a living document and may be changed as our organization evolves.

With the installation and dedication of the Stained Glass Window at Great Lakes Recruit Training Command Chapel, the SGW Fund was depleted. BJ McGuire has agreed to continue as chairwoman of the committee and has taken on the task of raising funds for another window.

The Bianchi-Gagnon Scholarship Fund was depleted with the awarding of the scholarship this year. Therefore, we are down to one scholarship again and we will be announcing the new scholarship for WN in the December issue. The scholarship chairwoman, Betty Hand, will also be looking for ways to increase the Scholarship Fund to make it self sustaining.

Take time to become familiar with the new listing of National Officers and Staff in this issue. You will be seeing some new

faces and names, and others that are familiar to you but may be in a new position: Jo Adamson, 1st Vice President; Betsy Waddell, 2nd Vice President; Monica O'Hara, Treasurer. Jo Adamson was plying her persuasive tactics in securing Regional Reps for Regions IX and X!

Special thanks go to all the Unit Presidents, State Directors, Regional Representatives, elected officers and staff members who have served the past two years but are not able to continue. Thank you, ladies, I know you will be supporting WAVES National in other capacities.

We had an incident recently when a unit treasurer passed away and her name was the only one on the unit's bank account. Ladies, it is imperative that **at least two names** be on your unit's bank account. National was contacted to help resolve this issue and secure another name on the account.

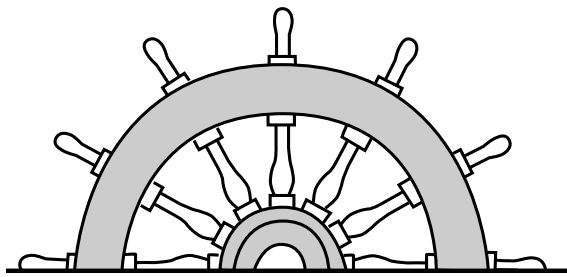
NAME CHANGE PROPOSAL

HEARTSPRING PROJECT

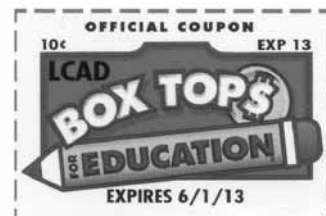

“Gray Area” TRICARE

Starting September 1, retired Guardsmen and Reservists who are not yet aged 60 (“gray area” retirees) can purchase TRICARE coverage for themselves and their families.

Those eligible may enroll in the new TRICARE Retired Reserve (TRR) program now and health care coverage will start on October 1.

The program is open to all “gray area” retirees who are not also eligible for the Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) program, as well as their spouses, dependent children, and survivors.

Unlike the TRICARE Reserve Select program for drilling reservists – in which premiums are subsidized by 72% - TRR premiums will be unsubsidized. For 2010, the member-only premium is \$388 a month and family coverage is \$976 a month. The rates increase to \$408 and \$1,020 respectively on January 1, 2011.

FROM THE CHIEF

One June 2 and 3, 2010 Vicki Orem and I spent two exciting days to promote WAVES National at the 23rd Annual Sea Service Leadership Association (SSLA) Women’s Leadership Symposium that was held at the Washington Hilton in Washington, DC. What an event! It is dedicated to providing professional development through networking, education and mentorship of women from all three maritime armed services.

Approximately 1,000 women of the Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard were in attendance at this largest gathering of military women in uniform. Each service met separately to discuss issues affecting their respective service. Of

particular importance to the Navy attendees was the mention of the policy change to assign women to submarines. Men from the three sea services also attended to learn about the issues concerning women and to take the information back to their commands.

Many high ranking officers of the three services were in attendance as speakers for their respective service. ADM Gary Roughead, Chief of Naval Operations (CNO), was the Keynote Speaker for the Navy. Other speakers included active duty high ranking female officers and retired female flag officers.

I must say that I was impressed with the caliber of the young women in the

Navy today. They had a very professional attitude and were quite sharp in their military appearance. How exciting it was to see so many of these young women who were Chief’s, Senior Chief’s and Master Chief’s at such a gathering!

BRONZE VETERANS' MEDALLION AVAILABLE

Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric Shinseki has announced that the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is offering bronze medallions to attach to existing, privately purchased headstones or markers, signifying a deceased's status as a Veteran.



“For Veterans not buried in a national or state Veterans cemetery, or those without a government grave marker, VA is pleased to offer this option that highlights their service and sacrifice for our country,” said Secretary Shinseki.

The new item can be furnished instead of a traditional government headstone or marker for Veterans whose death occurred on or after Nov. 1, 1990, and whose grave in a private cemetery is marked with a privately purchased headstone or marker.

Under federal law, eligible Veterans buried in a private cemetery are entitled to either a government-furnished

grave marker or the new medallion, but not both. Veterans buried in a national or state Veterans cemetery will receive a government headstone or marker of the standard design authorized for the cemetery.

More information about VA-furnished headstones, markers, and medallions can be found at <http://www.cem.va.gov/cem/hm/hmtype.asp>.

The new medallions will be available only to Veterans buried in private cemeteries without a government headstone or marker. Families of eligible decedents may also order a memorial headstone or marker when remains are not available for interment.

Information on VA burial benefits can be obtained from national cemetery offices, from the VA Web site on the internet at www.cem.va.gov or by calling VA regional offices toll-free at 1-800-827-1000.

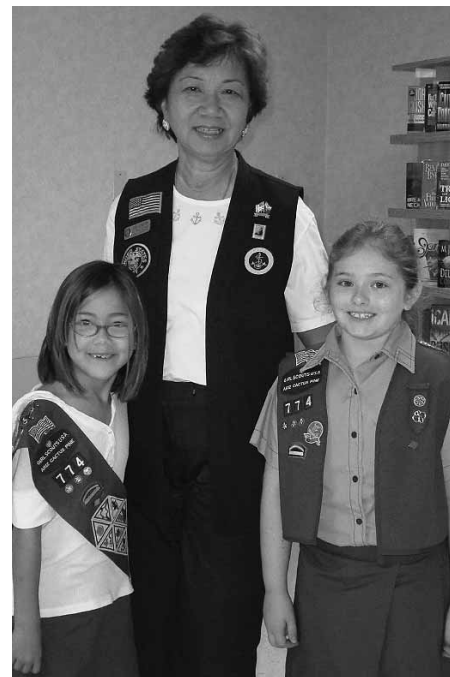

Sailors of the Year Make History

WASHINGTON (NNS) -- The 2009 Sailor of the Year winners, who for the first time in history are all women, were meritoriously advanced to Chief Petty Officer during a ceremony held at the Navy Memorial July 22.

Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Gary Roughead was the guest speaker at the pinning ceremony hosted by the Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy (MCPON)(SS/SW) Rick D. West.

"What I like most about this program is that these four Sailors know the Navy appreciates their dedication and performance, and expects even more of them in the future," said Roughead. "Their advancement today is an affirmation of the potential the Navy sees in them as future Chief Petty Officers and senior enlisted leaders at their next commands."

"A lot is expected of us, and it's a greater responsibility, but we are going to lead our Sailors and keep doing what we've been doing," said Cortez after the advancement ceremony. "This was such an awesome experience. I feel like I'm on top of the world, and it's just incredible."

The Sailors of the Year and their families toured the White House, visited historical sites around D.C., met with residents at the Armed Forces Retirement Home, and attended special events

held in their honor throughout the week before their advancement ceremony.

The Sailor of the Year program was established in 1972 by the Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Elmo Zumwalt and Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy John Whittet to recognize an individual Sailor who best represented the ever-growing group of dedicated professional Sailors at each command and ultimately the Navy. When the program began, only the Atlantic and Pacific Fleet Sailors were recognized. Within ten years, the Sailor of the Year program was expanded to include the shore establishment and Navy Reserve Sailors.
